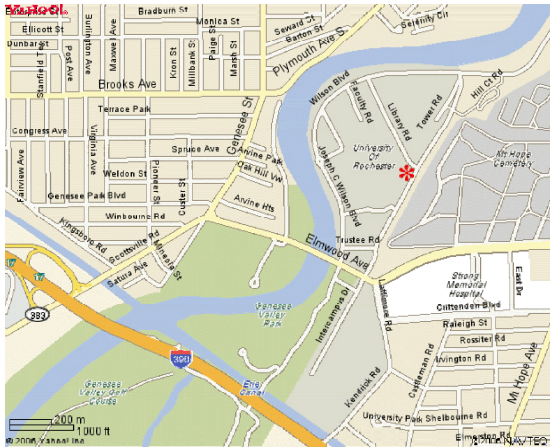


## Directions

Come to the University of Rochester River Campus (if you're arriving on Route 390, exit at Scottsville Road). Enter from Elmwood Avenue on Wilson Boulevard, then turn right onto Trustee Road and immediately left onto Intercampus Drive. Go about 2 blocks, turn left, and park in the Library Road lot beside the large, domed Rush Rhees Library. The Meliora (with blue canopy over doorway) is to the right of the Library toward the river. The Retreat will be upstairs in Salon D.

## When & What

On September 23, 2006, medical students and community physicians will be converging on Rochester from the Western NY region to kick off our first Upstate MCCF Retreat with a stimulating day of feasting, fellowship, and education. ## Where

## About Dr. Fountain

A graduate of Colgate University, the University of Rochester School of Medicine (*Class of 1956!*), and Johns Hopkins University, Daniel E. Fountain, MD, MPH, served as a medical missionary in the Congo for thirty-five years with the American Baptist Board of International Ministries. During that time, he was the director of health services of the Baptist Church of Western Congo and the director of Vanga Evangelical Hospital in the Democratic Republic of Congo (formerly Zaire).

Dr. Fountain is the founder and former director of several health programs in Africa, including a health care training institute and a rural health care network.

A recognized authority on the treatment of persons with AIDS, Dr. Fountain is the recipient of numerous awards for community health service. In 1984, he and Rev. Felicity Matala established an integrated medical-pastoral care ministry in the Vanga Hospital for the healing of the whole person. He directed the ministry until 1996.

Dr. Fountain currently serves on the faculty of the Christian Medical & Dental Association's Continuing Medical Education Program and as an Assistant Professor at King College and Director of the Global Health Care Center masters degree program. He has served as an Associate of MAP International and from 1996-2001 as a Consultant to Southwestern Medical Clinic in Michigan.

Dr. Fountain teaches internationally about the importance of caring for the whole person. He is also the author of numerous books in English and French on community health and primary health care, including *God, Medicine and Miracles*; *Primary Diagnosis and Treatment*; *Let's Build Our Lives*; and *Health, the Bible and the Church*. Dan and his wife Miriam live in Florida where they enjoy gardening, music, and family.
